





It was sunny and seventy-five as the 66th annual National Land and Range Contest welcomed qualified participants from over thirty states. Over 150 4-H and FFA teams gathered near Oklahoma City to compete for the title of national champion. South Dakota FFA was well represented, sending three teams in the range division; Sturgis, Wessington Springs, and Clark; three teams in the land division; Lennox Sundstrom, Kadoka, and De Smet, as well as three teams in the homesite division; McCook, Highmore, and Lennox Sundstrom.

During early May, contestants spent a week in Oklahoma practicing and competing in the national contest. Contestants from South Dakota had to adjust to the red soil of the southern United States as well as adapt to the many new plant varieties not found in the northern plains. Early in the week, members had the chance to go through some practice sites and plant lines before digging into the competition.

Overall South Dakota FFA members worked hard and came out with some success. The top teams in all three divisions included; McCook Central (16th out of 50) in homesite evaluation, Lennox Sundstrom (38th out of 92) in land judging, and Sturgis (12th out of 24) in Range Judging.



Simon to Run for National FFA Office



Alison Simon, who served as the 2016-2017 State FFA President, will represent South Dakota as the state's National FFA Officer Candidate at the National FFA Convention scheduled for Oct. 25-28, 2017 in Indianapolis, IN.

The National FFA Officers will also spend time in Washington, D.C., but their home office is in Indianapolis.

Simon will begin interviews on Sunday, Oct. 25, 2017, and continue with those interviews and National Officer Candidate activities until the 2017-2018 National FFA Officer Team is announced on Saturday, Oct. 28, 2017 at the final session of the 90th National FFA Convention.
