# FFA members package 50,580 meals during Living to Serve Day

The blue corduroy jacket is a familiar symbol of the FFA organization, worn as part of official dress during most FFA activities. On April 8th at the South Dakota FFA convention in Brookings, as part of a SD FFA Living to Serve Day, members removed their jackets and rolled up their sleeves to help stop hunger.

Grants from Pioneer and the National FFA made this project possible, and also provided t-shirts for participating students. This service project exemplified the portion of the FFA motto which states "Living to Serve" by teaming up with industry to fund a Meals of Hope, hands on project that combats hunger. SD FFA members and DuPont Pioneer staff measured, poured, sealed and boxed 50,580 meals in assembly line fashion throughout the day-long event. Members stopped in between workshops and competitive events throughout convention and left the event knowing that by giving a few minutes of their time they would make a significant difference in the life of a person less fortunate then themselves.

For less than \$.25/meal, Meals of Hope food packages include a comforting bowl of Macaroni and Cheese (fortified with soy protein and 21 vitamins and minerals). The 50,580 meals will be distributed across SD through Feeding South Dakota. Meals of Hope recognizes the need to start with

charity at home, and focus on offering more than nutrition, providing a bit of hope to carry those in need through another day.

"The FFA organization believes strongly in the fourth line of the FFA Motto "Living to Serve", which is why we are very excited to receive grants from Pioneer and the National FFA as well as day of event manpower assistance and interaction from DuPont Pioneer staff," says Sandy Osterday, SD FFA Foundation President. Osterday shares, "The past few years we have incorporated a community service event into our annual South Dakota FFA state convention. The event gives students the opportunity to work together with FFA members from across the state to make items that will help those in need, the grants allowed us to surpass our goal and have our most successful event since we started the Day of Service project. Knowing we are helping those in need across our state is a great feeling."

# 2019 Celebrates 50 Years of Females in FFA

Meet the 1st SD Female Ag teachers who helped pave the way! We continue our celebration of this milestone by recognizing some of those pioneering individuals. We have tracked down and visited with a few of the first female Agriculture Education instructors. Here's what they have to say:

- **1. Eleanore (Sween) Iverson** from Volga, taught in 1976-77 in Woonsocket a year, then Huron two years with Darold Hehn in a two-teacher program. Dr. Hilda Gada let her sign up for Ag Ed at SDSU as the 1st female in Agriculture Education teacher education, but had to check with the Dean first! Eleanore said, "Timing is everything. There was an ag teacher shortage at the time, and I'm sure I only got hired because I had a degree and many were doing alternative certification." Despite being the first female ag teacher, she remembers everyone being very warm and welcoming. Even though many asked, "Why would you want to teach ag?" no one ever asked "What are you doing here?"
- 2. Eleanore shares that Lori Willoughby, from Mitchell, taught the same year in Highmore, but we were not able to track down Lori.
- 3. Another pioneer female ag teacher was Kristine Ranger, originally from northeast Michigan. She taught in Sisseton from 1980-84. She remembers losing lots of senior boys classes started,



because they didn't think she knew what she was doing. However, follows that, quickly sharing she focused on recruited 8th graders and doubled the size of her freshman class the 2nd year, showing she did know what she was doing. She felt readily accepted by other ag teachers, but more challenged in Sisseton, with the biggest acceptance issue being with jealous mothers of students, because as she did student SAE visits, and met with the students and dads, as they knew agriculture.

Ranger taught multi district students from several area schools, teaching shop, welding, wood working, small engines, animal science, etc. With no core curriculum, and one computer that no one really knew how to operate, she relied on an Ag Advisory Committee and a local alumni that she formed to help set curriculum. She fondly remembers dairy foods judging - then making lasagna afterwards with the cheese, working with a kid to castrate pigs, and teaching about bovine semen with a local advisory committee member watching class and being embarrassed. The FFA chapter did lots of community projects including painting the school stadium stands. Despite the challenges, Ranger says, "The good times definitely outweighed the bad. I enjoyed it, but it was very intense and looking back, I burned out by doing so much." She felt adopted by the community of Sisseton and still visits frequently for trail rides.

Only teaching four years, before returning to school, and then taking a job back home in Michigan, Ranger made a lasting impact. She helped organize the SD State FFA Alumni - developing a board of directors and constitution. She made lasting friendships with a self-proclaimed "the punk ag teachers" group including Rich Hetland, Marty Strasburg, Randy Jones and Monte Mason. Now Ranger runs KnowledgeNavigators.com - consulting with farms and people in food systems - helping dairy farmers with food systems, selling direct to consumers.

4. Barb Berndt, taught ag approximately 20 years, starting in the early to mid 1980's, although we are not exactly sure of her years of service, with the Northwest Area Multidistrict. This ag program was unique in that it was set up in a mobile trailer and moved between eight different schools, for one semester each covering the communities including Faith, Bison, Harding County,

Dupree, Timber Lake, and Isabel.

Chapter in Artesian, SD in the fall of 1982. In 1985, she also taught two ag classes a day in Woonsocket and 5 classes a day in Artesian and was the advisor for the Artesian FFA

and the Woonsocket FFA chapters. Reflecting back, Lori shared, "As a female instructor, I was treated like



any other young instructor, male or female, by fellow teachers. The challenges I faced were more from young men who didn't believe a woman could weld and work on motors. After the first few days of the curriculum, the challenges went away as students realized I didn't just talk but could actually do. I had great mentors in Leonard DeBoer, Richard Lubinus, and Bobby Muller. They were always at the end of the phone line when I had a question and I was always thankful Artesian was in their FFA district. After taking a 12-year hiatus to work in the agriculture industry, it amazed me when I came back to ag education and realized how many female instructors there were. At my first National FFA Convention as an advisor in 1983, I saw about 20 female instructors and when I went to the National FFA Convention in 1999 after returning to teaching, I was shocked to see almost half the instructors were women."



# Words & Deeds earn Streff family "FFA Family of the Year" Award




