The State FFA Degree, the highest degree conferred by the South Dakota FFA, was presented to 282 agricultural education students at the 93rd South Dakota FFA Convention. From these students, 16 went beyond the expectations of the state degree and were also recognized as the state star finalists.

These finalists were selected for having extensive records on their supervised agricultural experiences and for displaying high achievement and skills from their out-of-classroom entrepreneurship, placement, business or research experiences. At convention, each finalist was interviewed about their project(s) and were honored on stage for their performance throughout their FFA career. These students are recognized in four different areas: Star Farmer, Star in Agribusiness, Star in Ag Placement and Star in Agriscience. For the first time in over 90 years, South Dakota FFA Convention moved almost 400 miles from SDSU in Brookings to the Central States Fairgrounds in Rapid City. After having a virtual convention in 2020 due to Covid-19, the 93rd convention showcased the hard work of the nearly 1,700 students in attendance and recognized the sponsors and supporters who made this year's event possible.

The Kjerstad Event Center at the Central States Fairgrounds held the convention hall, some Career Development Events, the "Living to Serve" service project and a Career Carnival. Additionally, CDES were also hosted by Western Dakota Technical College. Other changes to convention included schedule changes for each session, with state degree and scholarship recipients being recognized on Sunday, April 11, and other changes to Monday and Tuesday's sessions. With so many uncertainties amidst a global pandemic, many challenges were faced in planning and conducting this year's event. However, without the support of volunteers, sponsors, advisors and CDE faculty/industry chairs, this event would not have been possible. 












Growing our Membership Takes Time and Energy

South Dakota FFA Agriscientists Recognized

BROOKINGS, S.D. - South Dakota FFA agriscientists were recognized and awarded for their projects at the 93rd South Dakota FFA Convention.

FFA members competed in the state agriscience fair on March 31, with results being announced at state convention. These students use scientific principles and emerging technologies to solve complex problems related to agriculture, food and natural resources in six different categories (Animal Systems; Environmental and Natural Resource Systems; Food Products & Processing Systems; Plant Systems; Power, Structural & Technology Systems; Social Systems). Projects involve extensive research as well as writing a written report including information on previous studies related to the topic, their research and findings. Students can compete in the Agriscience Fair as an individual or with a team in separate divisions:

- 1. Individual member in grades 7 and 8
- 4. Team of two members in grades 9 and 10
- 2. Team of two members in grades 7 and 8
- 5. Individual member in grades 11 and 12
- 3. Individual member in grades 9 and 10
- 6. Team of two members in grades 11 and 12

The South Dakota FFA Family of the Year honors a family's long-term involvement in the South Dakota FFA/Agriculture Education program. Awarded by the South Dakota FFA Foundation, the 2020 and 2021 families were recognized at the 93rd South Dakota FFA Convention on April 12 in Rapid City.

"This award recognizes a South Dakota FFA family that has gone the extra mile for the FFA at the local and state levels through their words and deeds. These families model the FFA mission, '...developing premier leadership, personal growth and career success through agriculture education.' We are proud to recognize them with this special award," Gerri Ann Eide, South Dakota FFA Foundation Executive Director, said.

2020 South Dakota FFA Family of the Year: Tonak Family



The 2020 recipient of this award is the **Tonak family**, including **Lori, Dan & Nicole**, along with their children, spouses and grandchildren: Samantha Tonak and fiance Michael Pettit; Ashley (Tonak) and Jordan Wiesen, and son Holten; Logan; Jennifer; and Reed and daughter Camryn.

The Tonaks put the phrase from the FFA Creed, "a faith, born not of words but of deeds" into action. Dan reflects, "The biggest influence I had in becoming an ag teacher was the love for agriculture our father instilled. My first choice was to be a farmer, but that wasn't in the cards." Lori adds, "I started college as a dairy production major but was intrigued by the variety of courses Ag Ed majors were taking. After much soul searching, as my mom never wanted me to enroll in an agriculture course in high school, I switched to Ag Ed and never looked back."

The name Tonak is almost synonymous with FFA in South Dakota. Active at the chapter, state and national levels of FFA, their association with the blue corduroy jacket spans decades. Siblings Lori and Dan, as well as Dan's wife Nicole, have, and continue to actively support FFA for more than 36 years. Their father was an FFA member, as were three additional siblings. Their youngest sister LaDonna was the first female state degree recipient for Clark FFA in 1983. Lori. as one of the first female agriculture education teachers. has taught more than 28 years. She started FFA chapters in Artesian and Kimball, as well as taught agriculture education in Tulare and Newell, and currently teaches online ag courses for the DIAL Virtual School. Dan has taught Ag Ed in Willow Lake for 34 years, where Nicole has been a huge supporter. They impact countless students in their own classrooms as well as other chapters. Dan has advised 27, and Lori, six, state winning teams/individuals in different events that advanced to nationals. Roxanne & Eric Knock, who had Lori and Dan, respectively, as advisors, share "They had a way of getting students invested in their own education and developing in them a drive to succeed. Lori had a passion for developing

students and uncovering their strengths. Dan helped students apply Farm Business Management principles to real life situations. Each of them gave students opportunities never imagined. They and their families have given a tremendous amount of time and talent to benefit FFA students throughout the state. This quote describes their family: 'There comes that mysterious meeting in life when someone acknowledges who we are and what we can be, igniting the circuits of our highest potential.' Thank you, Dan and Lori, for acknowledging the talent that students didn't see in themselves and to the entire family for supporting you in this endeavor."

Both Lori and Dan are active members of the South Dakota Association of Ag Educators and South Dakota Association of Career and Technical Education organizations, serving in officer positions and being recognized with various awards. Dan currently serves as past President for SDAAE, and Lori serves on the National Agriculture Education Council and currently serves on the South Dakota FFA Board of Directors. They also serve as liaisons for FFA Leadership and Career Development events, and Dan is a member of the South Dakota FFA Foundation Board. As parents and teachers, their children were active, influential and successful FFA members in the Kimball and Willow Lake chapters, where their FFA chapters served the community and its members by conducting countless service projects. Dan, Ashley, Jordan, Samantha, Jennifer, Reed and Logan served in chapter and district officer leadership positions. Nicole has judged and chaperoned countless FFA events, and through her business contacts, has helped coach and secure various sponsorships for local, district and state events and activities, including a grant for the FFA Ag Adventure Center at the South Dakota State Fair. The family has seven state and four American FFA Degree recipients and were members on eight teams that advanced to a national competition. Lori, Dan and Nicole have each received the Honorary State FFA Degrees. Ashley and Jordan are in their second year of sponsoring a scholarship for South Dakota FFA; Ashley and Jennifer actively judge numerous competitions at the district and state levels.

Nicole works with Farmers Business Network. Samantha works at Wagner Super Foods and does photography. Ashley served as a state FFA officer and now works for ADM. Jennifer interned for the South Dakota FFA Association and now works for LG Seeds. Logan works in production agriculture raising a small flock of sheep, growing crops and working for a local farmer. Reed works for Farmers Implement and Irrigation.

In addition to their own personal successes, the Tonaks continue to promote FFA through their actions, participating in chapter and state activities and supporting anyone involved. Every time they have been asked to help through their time, talents or treasure, the answer has been "Yes," without hesitation. They are always willing to judge district and area Leadership Development Events, state proficiency awards, offer encouragement to students no matter their chapter, and help youth from across the state become more knowledgeable about opportunities in FFA and agriculture. They are verbal advocates for agriculture education/FFA and all it can do for young people.

Leading by example, always being willing to step forward and do a hard task, giving their time to something they believe in and helping other teachers, friends or community members, the Tonaks never miss an opportunity to expound upon how FFA helped grow the values and personal traits they wanted in their children, and they want to help others receive that experience too. Dan shares, "FFA was a part of our children's lives before they were members. They were exposed to and around FFA activities from a very early age, with memories of pancake feeds and watching early morning parliamentary procedure practices while in elementary school. After three generations of FFA, it was a part of everyday life for our entire family. FFA was something we didn't stop and think about, we just did it and it still remains a part of everyday life. Nicole has been the biggest supporter, spending hundreds of hours doing thankless jobs behind the scenes to support our local activities as well as my involvement and student's involvement in state and national activities. As an Adult Farm Management Instructor, my sister Lori provides education and assistance to farm families in financial management and analysis, but also continues to support FFA by serving on national level boards that assist Ag Education and the FFA." Ashley adds, "being involved meant developing communication and leadership skills while getting a hands-on approach to all the agriculture industry has to offer. I met people, traveled, and developed my most valued friendships. Ultimately it shaped the trajectory for my career and my life.'

The Tonak family not only gives their time to the FFA – they give it to several other organizations, including: their church, city council, local ambulance and fire services, community daycare board, Kimball Center Food Pantry, Cargill Cares, Paragon Ridge CTE Consortium, 4-H, Midwest Cattlemen's Association, American Society of Agronomy, College Students' Association, hunt safe program, SD Sheep Growers, and Snowdrifters. They are all active in the agriculture industry and all actively seek ways to help educate and support Agriculture Education and FFA chapters through their careers.

2021 South Dakota FFA Family of the Year: Sanderson Family



The 2021 recipient of this award is the **Brad and Kathy Sanderson family** of rural Lake Preston. In addition to Brad and Kathy, the Sanderson family includes their five adult children, spouses, and grandchildren: Nathan and Tiffany, along with their son Carter; Bryan; Kelly and Bill Jensen, with their children Hunter, Josie and Rylie; Jared and Carrie, with their children Addilene, Isabelle and Ettalynn; and Lee and his wife Heidi. The Sandersons have a long history of involvement in South Dakota FFA. Each of the family's seven FFA members have held multiple chapter offices and each received their state FFA degree. Collectively, the family has two American degree recipients, two state officers, and participated in more than 20 different Career Development Events (CDEs). The Sandersons have been especially active in livestock judging, with each of the five Sanderson children participating in that CDE, including two state champion teams.

Beyond their time as active FFA members, the Sanderson family has given back to the organization as well. Family members have served as local and state CDE judges numerous times, conducted chapter and state officer interviews, and received five honorary chapter and four honorary state degrees for their contributions to the organization. The family has also sponsored various activities and donated 60 FFA jackets to students through the South Dakota FFA Foundation.

In high school, Brad served as President of the Flandreau FFA Chapter and participated in several CDEs. Following graduation, he has given freely of his time, judging various events, including exhibits at the State Fair and state proficiency awards; speaking at chapter banquets; interviewing chapter and state officer candidates; and serving as an advisory committee member to the Lake Preston and Arlington chapters. 
