

WYATT DEJONG ELECTED TO 2010-11 NATIONAL FFA OFFICER TEAM

"The Lord has made the 'impossible' in my life a reality," stated Wyatt DeJong, a native of Kennebec, SD, and member of the Winner FFA chapter, when asked about his many FFA experiences this past year. What a way to summarize his recent election as 2010-2011 National FFA Central Region Vice President! He is the fourth SD FFA member to ever serve as a national FFA officer.

"I have come to realize that I can show others they can succeed in a powerful

way," Wyatt says about his FFA experiences. "By giving everything I have, the FFA has shown me how I can let myself shine so that others can unlock themselves to the beauty inside each of them and shine even brighter." On Saturday, October 23rd, during the final session of the 2010 National FFA Convention, Wyatt showed us how someone from a rural SD cattle ranch can succeed in a big way. Convention attendees could feel the tension in the air as it came down to the moment the nominating committee started calling the names of the new officers. "Your new Central Region Vice President, from the state of South Dakota is... Wyatt DeJong!" Instantly, all South Dakota members and advisors were on their feet yelling and cheering as Wyatt raced his way on stage to take his place in FFA history.

Wyatt participated in a brief training in Indianapolis before returning to South Dakota to finish up his semester at SDSU and celebrate Thanksgiving. He has majors in agriculture education and animal science. Then he will take off a year of school to travel more than 100,000 miles; meet top leaders in business, government and education; visit approximately 40 states; and participate in an international experience tour to Japan. His responsibilities will include providing personal growth and leadership training for students, setting policies that shape the future of the organization, promoting agricultural literacy and representing the National FFA Organization.

With a personal mission to make an impact, not just an impression, DeJong says he has "a much bigger purpose in life – adding values to others instead of focusing on myself. Congratulations Wyatt on your outstanding achievement; South Dakota is proud of you!

SOUTH DAKOTA STAR FINALISTS SHOWCASE SAES

This year 3,500 FFA members received the American FFA Degree, the highest degree a member can obtain within the FFA Organization. From those 3,500 members, sixteen are chosen as National STAR Finalists based on their Supervised Agricultural Experience. In the STAR program, there are fourfinalists in each of the four STAR areas – Star Farmer, Star in Agribusiness, Star in Ag Placement, and Star in Agriscience. This year, South Dakota was proudly represented by three National Star Finalists in 3 different areas.

Dustin Palmquist of the McCook Central FFA Chapter was selected as a Star Finalist in the area of Star in Agricultural Placement. Palmquist's SAE consists of a custom silage cutting operation.

Also representing South Dakota, Kyle Zulk of the McCook Central FFA Chapter was selected as a Star Finalist in the area of Agribusiness. In Zulk's SAE, he worked on a diversified crop and livestock operation as well as an employee for the agronomy department of Central Farmers Cooperative.

South Dakota's third Star was Steven Zemlicka of the Florence

FFA Chapter in the area of Agriscince. Zemlicka's SAE involves four different research projects in which three involved food science and agricultural processing.

After being selected, the three finalists completed an interview process at the 83rd National FFA Convention in October. All STAR Finalists we also given a VIP tour of businesses in Indianapolis, visited with FFA members about the importance of Supervised Agricultural Experience, and conducted radio interviews for several radio station in the country. Each finalist received \$500 for becoming a finalist, and their parents received the Honorary FFA Degree during the STAR Pageant at the Saturday morning session of Convention. Even though none of the three Star Finalists was able to claim the title of American STAR, all three have acquired a useful set of skills from their SAEs, look forward to promising career opportunities, and have set a standard in SAEs that all members should strive to achieve.

"Owning and running a business has its ups and downs," states Palmquist when asked about his SAE, "but if you work hard, in the end, you will never regret what you have accomplished."

Like the Star Finalists, the Proficiency Finalists will also complete an interview process while attending the National FFA Convention. This year South Dakota is proudly represented by nine National Proficiency Finalists. These finalists include: (A) Autumn Krueger in Agricultural Education, (B) Taylor Osterberg in Ag Mechanics Repair and Maintenance Entrepreneurship, (C) Ethan Vanderwal in Agricultural Services,(D) Andy Dale in Diversified Crop Production Entrepreneurship, (E) Angela Hansen in Diversified Horticulture, (F) Ethan Javers in Grain Production Entrepreneurship, (G) Erik Anderson in Grain Production Placement, (H) Jessie Faris in Home and Community Development, and (I) Jesse Knox in Outdoor Recreation. Ethan Vander Wal won the Agricultural Services proficiency this year.


Through years of hard work and dedication, these students have put their talents and abilities to effective use through the development of the


