The State FFA Degree, the highest degree conferred by the South Dakota FFA, was presented to 282 agricultural education students at the 2020 South Dakota FFA Convention. Certain students rise to the top as star finalists. These individuals spend countless hours working on their projects and enhancing their potential for future jobs by gaining hands-on experience and developing technical skills. After a review of the students' supervised agricultural experience program and records, four finalists were selected in each category prior to state convention. The finalists interviewed in front of a panel and the most outstanding were selected to be the State Star Farmer, Star in Agribusiness, Star in Placement and Star in Agri-Science. Each State Star will receive a \$300 cash award and the finalists each receive \$75.

Chapter Chatter

Bridgewater-Emery FFA had a FFA Plant Sale that took place the middle of May. Students in the agriculture classes were sent home potting soil, seeds, and planting trays to monitor the starting of plants at home. This helped keep students engaged in hands on learning and provide the FFA Chapter an opportunity to help out those wanting to plant a garden in the social distancing time.

Brookings FFA had originally planned to build beds for Sleep in Heavenly Peace, an organization that helps ensure that no child has to sleep on the floor. However, socially distancing restricted their ability to make the beds this year, so instead, they have donated their service project funds to their school district's backpack project and their community food shelf.

Deubrook FFA did not let a pandemic put a halt to their service projects. Instead, they utilized their creativity and social media to engage their town in a community cleanup.

McCook Central made history in South Dakota for hosting the first virtual career development event in the state. Over 70 chapters participated in the event with over 1,100 students competing in Ag Mechanics, Agronomy,

Dairy Cattle Evaluation, Farm Management, Floriculture, Food Science, Horse Evaluation, Livestock Evaluation, Milk Quality and Products, Natural Resources, Nursery Landscape, Poultry Evaluation and Veterinary Science CDEs. They also hosted a virtual awards banquet where new chapter officers and awards were announced.


Webster FFA had 9 Agricultural Education students from the Webster Area school toured the Watertown ethanol bio refinery on 1-16-20. Students learned about water quality, corn moisture content, enzymes, emulsifiers, pH controls and that each plant has its own recipe to make the alcohol. The plant is getting about 2.95 gallons of alcohol per bushel of corn. The plant has a goal of taking in 200,000 bushel of corn per day. The plant then markets its alcohol, dried distillers' grain, corn syrup and corn oil. Thank you for allowing us to visit your biological refinery.

Winner FFA hosted a #WinnerWalkWednesday challenge to encourage the community to get out and breathe some fresh air every Wednesday during the month of April. Each post with the hashtag received an entry into a drawing for a free FFA t-shirt. It was an awesome success and it was fun seeing the creativity of people out taking walks or runs.

Long time Ag Teachers Retire

Successful agriculture education programs and FFA chapters are only possible because of our amazing agriculture instructors. These dedicated individuals put in countless hours above and beyond the school day to educate, inspire, and motivate the future workforce of SD. Saying "thank you" is not enough. We want to honor two teachers retiring this year after more than 30 years each of serving "Here by the Owl" and with them well on their next endeavors.



Mr. Jim Wilson began his career as an Agriculture Education Teacher the fall of 1985 when he became the Ag-Ed teacher in Marion, SD. He taught in Marion for 10 years and then had a two-year break, took the Lennox position and has remained there for the past 23 years.

He has had a lot of success with his students in addition to being named Ag Teacher of the year twice and was also awarded the Lifetime Achievement Award from the state CTE Association.

One of the biggest accomplishments of the learning lab in Lennox that was

recently is the addition of the learning lab in Lennox that was actually a project designed by his daughter, Erin (Lennox '09) from her Master's program. The learning lab has opened up a whole new dimension to the Ag-Ed/FFA program in Lennox. A Hoop building for livestock, a greenhouse, and an outdoor classroom have given the students new opportunities they might not have been able to experience without its existence.

Being an Agriculture Education teacher and FFA Advisor is unique in comparison to other classroom teachers because it is an opportunity to build lifelong relationships with the students. Watching students grow and learn throughout their Ag-Ed/FFA experiences and opportunities are the most satisfying.

Future plans include getting some projects done around the acreage, fishing, and working with his sheep.

Advice to FFA members: Take advantage of all the opportunities the FFA has to offer and don't be afraid to try something new.



Mr. Doug Hauk taught from 1976-2020 for Haakon County School District, in Philip, SD.

Some of his achievements include: Outstanding Agriculture Education program in 2020, Outstanding Agriculture Science Teacher in 1999, Society of Range Management Outstanding Service Award, SDAAE 40 Year Service Award, coaching 24 state champion FFA teams, and two national champion FFA teams.

Under Mr. Hauk's leadership, FFA members developed the Kiddie park by the pool, completed the dirt work for the park contour, and built and installed the playground equipment. Philip FFA developed the Lake Waggoner Camp Ground - designed the layout, presented the plan to the county for approval to use the land for the campground, installed the electrical hook ups and concrete camping pads, built picnic tables, purchased gravel for the parking areas, built and installed the camp shades, and constructed the metal campground and beach sign. FFA members constructed the shade cover at the shooting range, built and installed the signs, and constructed the scoring stand

and sitting benches at the trap range. Much of the funding was possible by grants written and applied for by FFA members. The FFA chapter built the retaining wall and leveled the soil, installed erosion mesh, planted grass and spruce trees and installed irrigation behind the "Lasting Legacy" Monument. They constructed raised flower beds and flower containers at the nursing home/hospital court yard and apartments, where they donate and plant flowers yearly. The Philip FFA chapter was recognized numerous times as a Gold level Building Our South Dakota Community chapter.

Mr. Hauk is heavily involved in the community: announcing for school activities, auctioneering community events and fundraisers, on the MTI advisory board, on boards for the Bad River Rural Water System, Philip Arena Association, Lake Waggoner Golf Course, and National Mutual Benefit Insurance Co., a Jaycee, baseball coach, and Hunt Safe instructor.

Mr. Hauk is excited to have the opportunity to go hunting and fishing on the good days, not just the available days. HE will continue to raise cattle, spoil the grandkids(more), and build his own green house.

Advice for future FFA members: Take advantage of all the opportunities that FFA offers, the more activities you are involved in the higher the caliber of opportunities that arise for you.






Career Carnival






