46 Earn the Golden Key

Forty South Dakota FFA members will receive the coveted gold American Degree key, the highest degree awarded by the National FFA Organization. This final step in the FFA Degree system encourages students to grow, achieve, and establish themselves in an agricultural career. Attaining the American FFA Degree requires a solid commitment to agriculture and FFA. This honor recognizes demonstrated leadership abilities and outstanding achievements in agricultural business, production, processing and service programs. Recipients must have earned \$7,500 through a supervised agricultural experience program and productively invested those earnings.

Only about one half of one percent of the total national membership attains this high honor. The recipients will be honored at a reception on October 26, 2012 and the awards ceremony takes place October 27, 2012 at the 85th National FFA Convention in Indianapolis, IN. New Century Farmer



On July 8 – 18,50 FFA members from 25 different states travelled to Des Moines, Iowa to attend the New Century Farmer conference. New Century Farmer is a program sponsored as a special project of the National FFA for college age students who plan to pursue a career in production agriculture. Representing South Dakota was Ana Schweer, a Watertown native and 2012 SDSU graduate in Dairy Production; and Maria Rausch, a Hoven native and junior Animal Science major at SDSU.

Among the topics covered by speakers and during the sessions were economics, finance, farm succession, the Farm Bill, new and emerging farm machinery, career success, and technology. Perhaps one of the most important things attendees did was to create a vision statement for the future of their own operations. Through these vision statements they defined the purpose of their operation and set goals related to the ethics, efficiency, and quality of agricultural products. Attendees were also able to establish important network connections with others from across the nation. Maria Rausch said, "I always knew agriculture was diverse, but meeting agriculturists from across the country and learning how they make their operations work really opened my eyes to seeing more of the big picture of how we produce food, fuel, fiber, and natural resources for the world. It was really cool to learn from producers my age about cotton and peanut farming in Georgia, and how they produce and harvest fruit and berries in Oregon."

Members were selected on a series of essays that they wrote explaining why they've chosen production agriculture as a career, the role they play in their current farming operation, and their expected path to production agriculture after graduation from college.

Feeding Our Own Communities: Food For All

Three South Dakota FFA chapters have been awarded Food For All grants, which is a grant through National FFA that provides money to chapters to support year-long service learning projects. Chapters receiving the grants are to use the money to research and implement solutions that provide food to alleviate local need and to educate the public and youth about how to sustain food production.

The West Central FFA chapter received \$2,500, which they are using to develop a Back Pack

Program that provides breakfast, lunch and a snack for children who qualify for free or reduced lunch for the weekend. In their project, Hunger Helpers, members also provide

vegetable plants for family gardens with the understanding that extra produce grown by families will be donated to local food pantries, the senior citizen center, or the school lunch program. They also are developing and presenting community education gardening workshops to help educate others on how to help supplement their family's food supply.

The Viborg/Hurley FFA chapter received a \$2500 grant, which they are using to implement their project, Operation Fresh Fruits & Vegetables. Members developed a hydroponics system, which, in addition to the existing greenhouse, will extend the growing season to provide fresh fruits and/or vegetables year round to the local food pantry. FFA members are also holding two community education workshops near the community garden site to teach participants how to successfully use container gardens to improve their family's nutrition.

Members are helping youth attendees make their own family patio gardens during a Food For All spring workshop. Those attending learned about the importance of a healthy diet and the advantages of growing their own food when possible.

The Food For All grant program is through the National FFA Organization, with funding provided by Farmers Feeding the World and the Howard G. Buffett Foundation. \$330,000 was provided to 140 chapters across 41 states.

Garretson's FFA chapter is using their \$1,589 grant to fight hunger by maintaining a half-acre garden and then donating the produce to food pantries in Garretson, Sioux Falls, Brandon and the local assisted-living center. To date, they have donated more than 3,500 lbs of produce! They used the grant money to purchase seed, a potato planter, and a potato digger. In their project, Food for the Hungry, Garretson. FFA members will also conduct three presentations about their project to help raise awareness in the community.

If you have ever played an instrument, you know just how hard it is to practice for hours upon hours to improve your performance. For three South Dakota FFA




Over 1,350 applications from across the nation were judged. The applications fit into 49 different categories ranging from

2012 Honorary American Degree Recipients

Each year, agricultural teachers with outstanding Ag Ed and FFA programs are recognized at the National FFA Convention with their Honorary American Degree. These teachers have developed programs that motivate and inspire students to reach their fullest potential. Some other characteristics of these programs are their high membership numbers in FFA out of the total number of students in Agricultural Education classes – 85% must be members - and that the teacher must have been instructing students for at least 10 years. This year's Honorary American Degree Recipient from South Dakota is Dave Ollila of Newell.

Dave Ollila was the agricultural education instructor and FFA advisor at Newell High School from 1991 to 2011. Prior to teaching in Newell, he was the ag instructor at Lemmon High School for two years. In his 21 years as the advisor of the Newell FFA Chapter, over 600 students were educated on the importance of the three-circle model, which consists of classroom/laboratory instruction, Supervised Agricultural Experience (SAE), and FFA activities. FFA members in the Newell Chapter were introduced to a variety of opportunities at the District, State, and National levels.

Honorary American Degrees are also presented to individuals who have provided exceptional service to agriculture, agricultural education, or FFA. A past member, state officer, and national officer candidate, Holly Marshall-Heber has been a mentor, supporter, and role-model to many FFA members and state officers within South Dakota. She annually serves on the stage crew at our state convention to ensure that the sessions run smoothly. Before convention, she spends time coaching the state officers with their retiring addresses and helping them prepare for the sessions that they will preside over. Holly also helps organize our national officer candidate selection process by recruiting nominating committee members, helping prepare practicums, and providing general advice on the overall process. She serves on the South Dakota Farm Bureau Young Farmers and Ranchers committee and is starting a county level Young Farmers and Ranchers group.
