Star Finalist Works His Way To Nationals

Cole Schock, McCook Central FFA member, from Salem SD, is an American Star in Agricultural Placement finalist. The American Star Awards are the FFA's highest achievement awards and represent the best of the best among thousands of American FFA Degree recipients. The award recognizes FFA members who have developed outstanding agricultural skills and competencies through the

completion of a supervised agricultural experience (SAE) program.

Schock's SAE began at Schock's Dairy, in 2012, where he worked until he started as an assistant to a South Dakota Select Sires representative in 2018. He went to work with Select Sires because he knew he wanted to continue to be involved with dairy. He earned his A.I. certificate in 2018, attended a 1-month training in Colorado, and then worked as a relief A.I. technician in South Dakota and Minnesota. In May 2019, he became a full-time A.I. service technician in North Central Colorado, and also began working at Mile High Dairy, in Mead, CO. He worked both of these jobs until May, 2020, when he returned to the family farm and continues as a Select Sires A.I. technician.

Schock's lifelong goal is to have his own dairy farm, but he recognizes the challenge of pursuing this dream, so decided beginning a career in the dairy industry would be a good first step. Schock says his favorite part is helping customers solve reproductive problems in their operations. "If I had to choose a least favorite part," Shock replied, "I would say the weather. Not all the weather conditions I've worked in are pleasant, like the extreme heat of Colorado summers and the crazy South Dakota winters."

The most challenging part for Schock was working through the increasingly diverse languages and cultures barriers of the agricultural workforce. Many employees of his Select Sires clients and coworkers at Mile High Dairy spoke little or no English. They struggled to communicate with one another, but eventually learned to show one another what they were trying to say. He has grown more knowledgeable of their language and picked up phrases that make understanding possible.

Schock is excited to represent South Dakota FFA as a American Star in Agriculture Placement finalist, showcasing the work he put into his SAE. As a finalist, Schock recorded and submitted a summary of his SAE and answers to several questions. National FFA has a panel of judges selecting the winner, which will be announced during the Virtual 93rd National FFA Convention & Expo, October 27-29th.

Proficiency Finalist Capitalizes on Experience, Strives for Gold

Hunter Eide, Gettysburg FFA, was selected as one of four national finalists in the Agriscience Research- Animal Systems proficiency area. Proficiency Awards honor FFA members who, through supervised agricultural experiences (SAEs), have developed specialized skills that they can apply toward future careers.

Eide started conducting research four years ago, after a family visit to McNenny Fish Hatchery, near Spearfish. While there, he met biologist Dr. Mike Barnes, who was looking for motivated high school students to do research outside of the hatchery environment for biosecurity reasons. Eide shares, "My SAE includes four research experiments on landlocked fall Chinook Salmon eggs. The focus varied from testing disinfectant rates on egg survival to testing the ability to delay egg fertilization for transportation to the hatchery, which would increase survival rates."

Hunter Eide, Gettysburg FFA, In addition to lots of research, Eide spent ten weeks for each of the four experiments incubating the eggs, and regularly recording mortality, eye up, and hatch rates.

Eide is most proud of being published in three peer reviewed, international, industry journals while in high school. His studies were shared with South Dakota fisheries biologists, and are changing the spawning industry of landlocked fall Chinook Salmon eggs, by reducing the cost and labor needed to fertilize the eggs as well as when and where biologists can fertilize eggs.

Eide shares, "Take it from me - I started out with no idea how to do a research project, what the scientific method was, or how to write a research paper. Here I am, four years later, a three time international peer reviewed published author, and a National FFA proficiency finalist! Anything is possible if you work for it."

Eide sent a five minute video to compete at nationals. Results will be announced Tuesday, October 27th at 7:00 pm EDT, during the Virtual National FFA Convention.



State Officers Take On Business & Industry Visits

August 5th-7th, the State FFA Officer team got to finally conduct FFA business in person and collectively visited 75 different South Dakota agricultural businesses & industries across the state. Split into three groups, each group visited different regions of the state (Western, Eastern, and Central). They were joined by local FFA members on some visits, which allowed members to learn about businesses in their backyards. There were three main goals of these visits:

- 1. Learn more about businesses as a component of South Dakota agriculture.
- 2. Learn about the future needs of industries in their field.
- 3. Share what agriculture education classes/FFA are doing to help meet the needs of South Dakota's future.

Each visit provided wonderful knowledge and takeaways, but some were extremely memorable. The officer team will use the knowledge learned to help motivate and connect members with agricultural opportunities throughout the year.

Hunter Eide and Elizabeth DeBoer visited locations in Wall, Phillip, Winner, Platte, and Kimball. They shared "Wall Meats was memorable because of how much the business is involved in their community. They have a Farm to Plate Model, where they process meat from local producers, and sell it at their local restaurant. This model allows the whole meat process to come full circle, as well as ensure a quality, local product." They also provide local meat to 13 local schools through a program called Beef to School. DeBoer remarked, "It was neat to see a business in a small town do so much for the surrounding community." The officers were accompanied by Lilly Wagner from the Wall FFA chapter.

Ryder Mortenson and Jackson McFaden ventured to central South Dakota and visited businesses in Seneca, Faulkton, Redfield, Bowdle, Hoven, Gettysburg, and Onida. They had a blast talking with professionals in their respective industries and learning about what they do. Seed cleaning was a new industry that sparked the pair's interest. McFaden was amazed how big an industry birdseed is in our state. Conversing with Matt Leisinger, owner of the seed cleaning business, the pair learned how smaller grains grown in our state are used for many purposes, including birdseed. Another business with a high learning curve for the pair was AMPI - Hoven Cheese Factory. Joined by Hoven FFA members, Mortenson and McFaden, saw cheese being made and took away the captivating bit of knowledge of how the smallest quality change in milk affects the quality of cheese.

Samantha Olson and Dirby Bawek traveled to the eastern side of the state, visiting Watertown, Milbank, Clear Lake, White, Volga, and Lake Benton, MN. At Ashgrove Dairy, like many other locations, they learned about all of the moving pieces on their operation, as well as opportunities they offer youth. For Olson and Bawek, their favorite part was being able to actively see the process of milk production, and all of the work that goes into the process. Olson also noted that Ashgrove Dairy offers a direct internship with South Dakota State University, allowing students to get hands-on experience in dairy production. At Stengel Seed and Grain, in Milbank, the officers were accompanied by Jessica Pillatzki, Milbank member. They learned about the expensive process in which seeds go through to be cleaned. Bawek shared, "I enjoyed learning how they take a different approach to seed and grain cleaning, since they work exclusively with organic seeds."




